The mentoring program hosted by Volunteer Youth Corps Inc. caters for the children in the Lodge that are having difficulty performing at their potential. In the month of January under the funding of the UNDP, we were able to successfully conduct peer education session with the children, with the objective of having them become change agents in their schools, communities and its environs. In these sessions the topic of discussion was directed to the implementation of behavior change as it deals with general mannerism and delinquent behavior patterns. The children were very interested in the topic and the message that was given. In these sessions they asked many questions and some even provided the answers. As an objective of the program the children will be participating in community out- reach projects. Presently VYC recruiting mentors to plan and supervise these community projects.
